Members, Leaders, Parents, and Friends,

How is everyone coming with their COVID—19 prompt journal? (See attachment with this email.) The journal can be entered as a static exhibit. It is available in word or pdf (if you want to type it), OR you can print and handwrite your responses.

Thank you to everyone who entered their livestock : beef, dairy, goats, sheep, swine, rabbits, and poultry on 4honline.com.

The ongoing COVID-19 rules and guidelines continue to be subject to change based on the progression of the virus through the state. On May 29, the SDSU Extension director released updated guidelines for all of Extension to follow. These guidelines are somewhat more relaxed than the previous guidelines and are as follows: Effective July 1 (providing we do not see major upswings in positive cases) we will be able to hold face to face programming/meetings with up to 15 people using social distancing of 6' and the use of face masks. As we move to August 1 (with the same stipulation of no major upswings) we will be able to move to 50 people in face to face programming/meetings using social distancing of 6' and face masks. With the addition of the newest guidelines I requested a Zoom meeting on June 4 to discuss this topic with all 4-H families. The majority of the families attending the zoom meeting voted to keep the **livestock**, **static**, **and youth in action activities virtual** (the original motion & vote from May 18 zoom meeting to go virtual remains intact & will be the method of delivery for 2020).

Each of the offices have equipment that can be used to help you with your virtual projects. Just contact the office to get on the list to use the equipment. We will need the videos recorded on a jump drive and brought in to the office between August 1-7. The youth-in-action recorded activities, static projects, and livestock projects will be evaluated and comment sheets will be emailed back to the youth along with a unique one of a kind video.

There will be more guidelines coming out on June 22. Expect more specific information on the virtual requirements and information about State Fair..

**Campbell County & Walworth County Shooting 4-H Shooting Sports: Match 3 of the** spring season cancelled.

Match Deadlines: Match 1– Feb.15; Match 2: Mar. 15; Match 3: cancelled; Match 4: opening July 1 running til end of August.

If the Coaches are willing to follow the guidelines, and wish to proceed they will need to set up a schedule after July 1 (after schedule is set it will be posted). The following guidelines will be required: face masks, social distancing of 6', and no more than 15 people in attendance at any practice or match. Effective August 1: the number of people can increase up to 50 still implementing social distancing of 6', and face masks.

If you have youth age 8 by January 1, and enrolled in 4-H they are eligible to participate in the Shotgun program. Please contact the County office for more information.















Registration papers for purebred livestock must be uploaded onto 4honline.com by Wednesday, July 1. If the papers are not uploaded animals will be moved to commercial classes and will not show in the breed class.
