FIRE HAZARDS ORDINANCE 2021-11

WALWORTH COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2021-11

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF FIRE HAZARDS IN WALWORTH COUNTY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Walworth County commissioners that the following restrictions in regard to open burning be imposed:

SECTION 1:

Walworth County Commission may impose a ban to prohibit or restrict open burning in order to protect the public health and safety pursuant to South Dakota Codified Law 7-8-20(18).

SECTION 2;

Open burning defined. For purposes of this ordinance, open burning means the intentional burning of any substance, whether natural or manmade, or the intentional casing off of any burning substance, whether natural or manmade, except the burning of such substance in a container sufficient so as to prohibit the escape of any of the burning substance, or any sparks, flames or hot ashes from the container. The escape of any of such burning substance, or the escape of any sparks, flames or hot ashes from any such container shall be deemed prima facie evidence that the container was insufficient so as to meet the exception from the definition of an open burning set forth herein. The maintaining of a fire in any interior fireplace, stove or furnace is specifically excluded from the definition of an open burning as contemplated by this ordinance. Fireworks which produce sparks are specifically included in the definition of open burning.

SECTION 3:

In the interest of public health and safety no person shall conduct open burning outside the municipalities in Walworth County when the National Weather Service has declared the South Dakota Grassland Fire Danger Index to be in the HIGH, VERY HIGH, or EXTREME category or has issued a RED FLAG WARING for any portion of Walworth County. The open burning ban will also be in place anytime a portion of Walworth County has been declared to be in a D2 (Severe Drought) category or above on the United States Drought Monitor. The prohibition against open burning shall automatically be suspended during any period the South Dakota Grassland Fire Danger Index falls below the HIGH, category, or the RED FLAG WARNING has been rescinded or cancelled by the National Weather Service. The South Dakota Grassland Fire Danger Index website indicates that the index that is set for the any particular day, begins at noon. For the purposes of this Ordinance, if the Grassland Fire Index has been set as High or above, that Index will be in place for that entire day.

SECTION 4:

Other than when deemed necessary by fire officials for the preservation of life and/or property, exemptions may not be granted during the conditions identified in Section 3.

SECTION 5:

This ordinance requires that the Mobridge Police Dispatch Center shall be notified before an open burn is conducted in Walworth County, specifying the date, time and place of the open burn. The Mobridge Police Dispatch Center shall also be notified when the open burn is completed, except for the otherwise legal use of fireworks.

SECTION 6:


Violations of this ordinance shall be subject to penalties pursuant to SDCL 7-18A-2; specifying a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars for each violation, or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed thirty days for each violation, or by both the fine and imprisonment; and an action of civil injunctive relief, pursuant to South Dakota Codified Law 21-8.



Fall River County Proclamation

A proclamation designating March 29, 2022 as "Welcome Home Veteran's Day"

Whereas, the Vietnam War was fought in Vietnam from 1961 to 1975, and involved North Vietnam and the Viet Cong in conflict with the United States Armed Forces and South Vietnam; and

Whereas, the United States became involved in Vietnam because policymakers in the United States believed that if South Vietnam fell to a Communist government then Communism would spread throughout the rest of Southeast Asia; and

Whereas, members of the United States Armed Forces began serving in an advisory role in the South Vietnamese in 1961; and

Whereas, as a result of the Gulf of Tonkin incidents on August 2, 1964, and August 4, 1964, Congress overwhelmingly passed the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution, on August 7, 1964, which effectively handed over war-making powers to President Johnson until such time as "peace and security" had returned to Vietnam; and

Whereas, in 1965, United States Armed Forces ground combat units arrived in Vietnam; and

Whereas, by the end of 1965, there were 80,000 United States troops in Vietnam, and by 1969 a peak of approximately 543,000 troops was reached; and

Whereas, on January 27, 1973, the Treaty of Paris was signed, which required the release of all United States prisoners-of-war held in North Vietnam and the withdrawal of all United States Armed Forces from South Vietnam; and

Whereas, on March 29, 1973, the United States Armed Forces completed the withdrawal of combat troops from Vietnam; and

Whereas, more than 58,000 members of the United States Armed Forces lost their lives in Vietnam and more than 300,000 members of the Armed Forces were wounded; and

Whereas, members of the United States Armed Forces, who served bravely and faithfully for the United States during the Vietnam War, were caught upon their return home in the crossfire of public debate about the involvement of the United States in the Vietnam War; and

Whereas, it was also the first time in history America failed to welcome its veterans back as heroes; and

Whereas, the establishment of a "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" would be an appropriate way to honor those members of the United States Armed Forces who served in Vietnam during the Vietnam War; and

Whereas, Hot Springs, SD, in Fall River County is known as the Veterans Town; and

Now, therefore be it resolved that the Fall River County Commissioners do hereby recognize March 29, 2022 as "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day". The Fall River County Commissioners further honors and recognizes the contributions of veterans of the Armed Forces who served in Vietnam.



2022 Statewide Ballot Measure

Constitutional Amendment C

<u>Title:</u> A Constitutional Amendment Requiring Three-Fifths Vote for Approval of Ballot Measures Imposing Taxes or Fees or Obligating over \$10 Million.

Attorney Explanation:

Currently the constitution requires that any new tax or tax increase must be approved either by voters or by two-thirds of the members of each legislative branch. To be approved by voters, such a measure must obtain a majority of the votes cast. This constitutional amendment requires that any initiated measure, proposed constitutional amendment, or referred measure imposing or increasing taxes must obtain three-fifths of the votes cast to be approved.

This constitutional amendment also adds the requirement that any initiated measure, proposed constitutional amendment, or referred measure obligating the state to appropriate \$10 million or more in any of the first five fiscal years must obtain three-fifths of the votes cast to be approved.

This constitutional amendment additionally requires any initiated measure, proposed constitutional amendment, or referred measure which imposes or increases fees to obtain three-fifths of the votes cast to be approved.

Full Text of Constitutional Amendment C:

A JOINT RESOLUTION, Proposing and submitting to the voters at the next primary election a new section to Article XI of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, relating to a three-fifths vote requirement for certain initiated or Legislature-proposed constitutional amendments and initiated or Legislature-referred measures.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

Section 1. That at the next primary election held in the state, the following amendment to Article XI of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, as set forth in section 2 of this Joint Resolution, which is hereby agreed to, shall be submitted to the electors of the state for approval.

Section 2. That Article XI of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

§16. Constitutional amendments or measures--Taxes or fees--Certain funding obligations--Vote required.

Any initiated constitutional amendment, initiated measure, constitutional amendment proposed and submitted to the people by the Legislature, or measure referred to the people by the Legislature that imposes or increases taxes or fees, and any initiated constitutional amendment, initiated measure, constitutional amendment proposed and submitted to the people by the Legislature, or measure referred to the people by the Legislature that obligates the state to appropriate funds of ten million dollars or more in any of the first five fiscal years after enactment, to be annually adjusted for inflation as determined by the Legislature, shall become part of the Constitution or statute only if approved by three-fifths of the votes cast thereon.
